Each Class did an activity to celebrate Indigenous culture and these can be seen as you walk through the library and see our Giant Serpent. It looks fantastic!




The Rainbow Serpent dreaming in Aboriginal society represents

Curriculum News

Children develop their reading skills, knowledge and understanding by reading regularly. Below are some strategies you might like to try at home to support your children's learning:

Encourage and model reading in the home

- Listen to your child read their reading material and ask specific questions related to what they have read
- Read with your child
- Share what you are reading with your child
- Read your child a bedtime story
- Read to your child in your family's first language
- Talk to your child about the different situations you find yourself in whereby you are required to read texts.

Teaching and Learning in the Year Four Five Six Unit (4/5P and 5/6S)

Our Religious Education program this term has so far been focused on the events that occurred after Easter with the Resurrection and the Journey to Emmaus.

Our literacy program continues to run smoothly as our genre focus turns towards a Persuasive focus. We have also been focused on increasing students' ability to brainstorm and mind map ideas. We are continuing with our targeted Literacy Groups within our two hour Literacy Block between Recess and Lunch. Within this time, we have dedicated half an hour to Writing, Spelling, Reading and Oral Language activities.

Within Numeracy lessons, we have been focused on Measurement. We have begun by exploring why we use standard units of measurement and the differences between the metric system and the imperial system.

In Science we have been learning about Earth's Place in the Solar System using OneNote and videos Integrated with Technologies.

On Monday as part of our Pupil Free Day, staff were involved in curriculum development and strategic planning in the areas of Religious Education, Literacy and Numeracy. The day proved to be a success with teaching staff coming away from the day with new learning.

Term 3 Preschool and Reception Intake

St. Joseph's School will once again have a Pre-school and Reception intake at the start of Term 3 this year. Our Term 3

new Pre-school children will replace those moving into Reception as part of our Term 3 Reception intake. A new class will be created for our Term 3 new Receptions which will be in the classroom next to our current R/1 Unit. The criteria for starting Pre-school or Reception on the first day of school in Term 3 is that a child will have turned 4 (Pre-school) or 5 (Reception) between 1 May and 31 October in that year. Commencing in Week 8 we will hold three transition visit mornings for our new Pre-school and Reception children with the aim of supporting their new start. Our Term 3 preschool enrolment number currently sits at 22. Our aim is to reach 30 enrolments which is our capacity.

School Master Plan Update

Demolition of our former front office building has now been completed. The next stage is the testing of our soil before building works commence. The current timeline of the project has a late November 2023 completion date.

OSHC News

The Department of Education have announced **legislation changes regarding the way payments for 'gap fees' are collected** from families.

From July 1, 2023, families must pay the 'gap fee' using electronic means.

Electronic means may include:

- direct deposit or bank transfer, including PayID
- online payment systems through third-party software
- bank or credit card, including mobile wallets
- BPAY or <u>Centrepay</u>
- prepaid debit card

Families will not be able to pay for childcare using cash.

The Department of Education will be monitoring compliance and take action if required.
